In the early years, our Association provided an audiometer for demonstrations, hearing tests, and public lip-reading sessions, training programmes, selling assistive hearing devices, and lobbying for better services.

Today, our ear nurses provide ear checks, ear wax removal services and hearing tests. We also have access to a resident Audiologist. We haven't been running social gatherings for some years however we're committed to getting out more in our community and making new connections.
